

**PROPOSED DISCONTINUANCE OF PROPOSED CLASS  
ACTION REGARDING MODEM HIJACKING  
JANUARY 29, 2007**

**Please read this entire notice carefully. It may affect your legal rights.**

Edith Carriere is the Plaintiff in a proposed class action against Bell Canada.

The action claims damages relating to modem hijacking.

The Plaintiff brought a Motion before the Court seeking to certify the action as a class proceeding. The Motion for Certification was heard May 18<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup>, 2006. Pursuant to written reasons dated June 13, 2006, Justice Crane struck-out the Plaintiff's Claim, granted leave to the Plaintiff to deliver a fresh Amended Statement of Claim and adjourned the Motion for Certification of the action as a class proceeding.

The Plaintiff subsequently decided that she would abandon the Motion seeking certification of the action as a class proceeding and discontinue the action.

Plaintiff's counsel, Scarfone Hawkins LLP, will not be proceeding with this action on behalf of any other proposed Representative Plaintiff.

The Court has set March 1, 2007 at 2:00 p.m. as the date for the hearing of the Plaintiff's Motion seeking leave to discontinue the action.
